This work is evolving rapidly. We will try to keep you updated on ways you can help. We believe there will be needs for household goods and clothing for the refugees.

If you are interested in being part of a group that will have direct contact with refugees in Springfield or Joplin, please let Jack Cormack (bsfarmjc@gmail.com) know. The International Institute https://www.iistl.org/iismo/ requires a background check for any volunteer. Once you have completed that, you will be eligible to be added to a group. There are training and orientation sessions.

Some JCP churches have committed to helping one or more families or individuals. This work includes outfitting an entire apartment, picking the person(s) up at the airport, and helping the refugees get connected with healthcare, employment, and other needs. Some, but not all, of this work requires a background check for each volunteer.


Presbytery-wide Advent Study via Zoom December 2, 9, 16, 23 at 7:00 pm Christmas in the Four Gospel Homes

Thinking About Race ...from the Anti-Racism Taskforce

Question 1: Members of a race can be identified by their:

- A. Blood group
- B. Skin color
- C. Ancestry
- D. Genes
- E. All of the above
- F. None of the above

Answer: F. None of the above. There are no traits, no characteristics, not even one gene that distinguishes all members of one so-called race from all members of another. The A, B, O blood groups can be found in all the world's peoples (Estonians and Papua New Guineans, for example, have the same frequencies). Skin color tends to correspond with latitude not race; sub-Saharan Africans,

Dravidians and Tamils from Southern Asia, and Melanesians from the Pacific all have very dark skin. Ancestry is difficult to trace. Go back 30 generations, less than 1,000 years, and you have a billion ancestors.

Question 2: Which species has the most genetic variation?

A. Humans

B. Chimpanzees

C. Penguins

D. Fruit flies

E. Elephants

Answer: D: Fruit flies. Fruit flies have been around for a very long time, but they also have a short life span, so lots of genetic mutations have accumulated over many generations. In contrast, modern humans are one of the most genetically similar of all species. This is because we are a relatively young species, and we simply haven't been around long enough to accumulate a lot of genetic variation. Also, humans have always moved, mixed and mated, so genetically speaking, we're all mongrels. Beneath the skin, we're all very similar.
